In this class, students will examine stories of extinct and endangered birds and discover the important role that zoos like the National Aviary play in helping vanishing species. 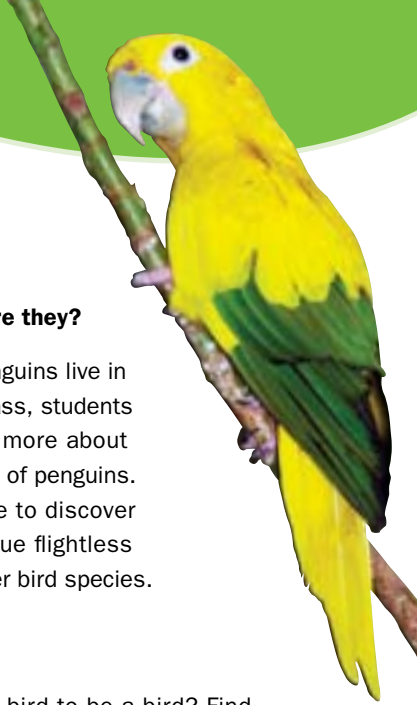

Schedule Information



How to schedule a program:

1. Choose your program. Please allow ample time to schedule your program, as all programs must be reserved at least three weeks prior to the program date.
2. Select several dates and times in case the date that you prefer is unavailable. Classes are unavailable from 12 pm – 1 pm due to staff scheduling.
3. Contact the Education Program Scheduler at 412-258-9439 or education.programs@aviary.org to make your reservation.
4. Please have a credit card available to hold your reservation. The credit card will only be charged upon completion of a program or in the event of a cancellation. If you wish to pay by check or cash, you may do so at any time prior to your program. If you wish to pay by credit card, the card given at the time of the reservation will be charged on the date of the program.
5. Upon receipt of the confirmation letter, please sign both copies and return a signed copy to the National Aviary.

Group Minimums:

All programs have a minimum of 10 paid students.
All groups must have at least 1 chaperone for every 10 students.

Cancellation and Rescheduling Policy:

- If you must cancel your visit, please contact us at least 48 hours in advance to reschedule or cancel for no fee. A \$50.00 cancellation fee will be charged to your holding credit card for failure to provide at least 48 hours notice. In the case of inclement weather the cancellation fee is waived.
- If you must reschedule your program, please contact us as early as possible and at least 48 hours in advance of your originally scheduled time. There is no fee for the first rescheduling of a program if you provide at least 48 hours notice. If you do not provide 48 hours notice or for subsequent rescheduling there is a \$50.00 fee. Please have multiple alternate dates for your program available at the time you call to reschedule.
- Failure to cancel or reschedule a program prior to the class, resulting in a "no call, no show" will be charged the full amount for the program.

Late Arrivals:

All groups are encouraged to arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled program. This will give your group enough time to check in and organize prior to the start of the program. Due to the number of classes scheduled each day, late arrivals will have time deducted from their program. If a group arrives more than half way into their scheduled class time, the class will be cancelled and the group given the opportunity to enjoy a self-guided tour.
