Dr. Katzner joins the Aviary from a National Science Foundation International Postdoctoral Research Fellowship at Imperial College in London, England. There he developed mathematical models of eagle populations in Kazakhstan to improve

the understanding of the factors that limit these populations and to develop improved monitoring programs. He also studied Griffon Vulture populations to better understand the threats to these populations, especially in light of current threats to vultures around the world.

Dr. Katzner's education includes a Bachelor of Arts degree in Biology from Oberlin College, a Master of Science degree in Zoology and Physiology from the University of Wyoming where he conducted research on pygmy rabbits, and a Ph.D. in Biology from Arizona State University where he led research on the ecology of eagles at a nature reserve in Kazakhstan.

Dr. Katzner has led or participated in bird research within Minnesota, Arkansas, Hawaii, Idaho, Wyoming, and Pennsylvania, as well as in the United Kingdom, Kazakhstan, Russia, Republic of Georgia, India, and China. He has also advised and assisted students in the United States, United Kingdom, Kazakhstan and Russia. He has been published in a variety of national and international research journals and wildlife magazines including Wildlife Conservation and Conservation Biology.

His new position at the National Aviary will expand our conservation projects and partnerships on regional, national and international levels.
