Charity Partners Win at 84 Lumber Classic

Vijay Singh wasn't the only winner in the 84 Lumber PGA Golf Classic this fall. Over 70 non-profits were invited to participate in selling advance tickets for the four-day event. Coordinated through the United Way of Allegheny County, charity partners were given the opportunity to sell tickets at \$10 each and keep the proceeds (the regular price was \$22). It was a win-win for the charities and for the organizers of the 84 Lumber Classic. Joe Hardy, owner of Nemaquin Woodlands and the Mystic Rock Golf Course, and his daughter, Maggie Hardy Magerko, were determined to have a star-studded field of golfers and record attendance. They had both - many of the top world players participated and the event broke all previous records, with more spectators at the final round than in all four days of previous tournaments ranking among the top five in the PGA for attendance.
